Recently, the **Mayor and Council Members** along with Small Business Administrator (SBA) Karen Mills toured MBA Waste Enterprises at their brand new 41,000 square foot recycling facility in Union City. With it, MBA Waste Enterprises will be able to recycle 50 tons of construction debris a day, hiring 30 new local employees.

The Georgia Municipal Association has appointed **Mayor Ralph Moore** as Chair of the Environment and Natural Resources Committee, which resulted in his appointment to GMA's Executive Board and Legislative Policy Committee. GMA has a long standing history of promoting advocacy, service, and innovation in government. Using his training and expertise in urban planning and public administration, Moore looks forward to meeting the increasing needs of municipalities.

**Councilwoman Shirley Jackson** serves as the Chair of the South Fulton Municipal Regional Jail Authority. This organization plays a vital role in protecting the public by providing pretrial detention services for local, state, and federal criminal justice agencies as well as a place where sentences imposed by the court will be served.

**Councilman Brian Jones** was recently re-appointed to the South Fulton Municipal Regional Water and Sewer Authority. The Board is responsible for acquiring and maintaining water supply sources to serve Union City, Fairburn and Palmetto. Jones works arduously to develop an alternative water solution for residents. He also serves as a key member of the National League of Cities' (NLC) Finance, Administration and Intergovernmental Relations committee and recently received the prestigious Certificate of Recognition from the Georgia Municipal Training Institute.

**Councilwoman Angelette Mealing** was appointed by the NLC to the FAIR Policy and Advocacy Steering Committee. This Committee has a major responsibility for developing policy positions in the areas of national economic policy, intergovernmental relations, municipal bonds and capital finance, and municipal management and administration. Mealing also received the prestigious Bronze level in NLC's Certificate of Achievement in Leadership Program. The Bronze level encompasses several curriculum areas strategically designed for local officials.



**Councilman Vince Williams** was selected by the NLC as a member of their Leadership Academy on Local Economic Competitiveness. This position opens critical doors for Union City to increase its global economic competitiveness. The Academy provides local officials and city staff with tools and knowledge to build economic relationships with businesses and cities around the world.

Williams was appointed to the 2011 Community and Economic Development Policy and Advocacy Steering Committee. This Committee plays a key role in shaping policy, while advocating on behalf of America's cities and towns on Capitol Hill, with the Administration, and at home in Georgia. He also received the prestigious Certificates of Recognition and Achievement as well as the Bronze level in NLC's Achievement in Leadership Program from the Georgia Municipal Training Institute.

## City Receives \$157,500 through Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program



*Protect Your Child from Drowning With These Simple Pool Safety Tips*

**D**rowning may be one of the most remorseful fatal accidents to occur at a home and is one of the major causes of accidents resulting in serious injury and death in children. Parents should not assume that their child is safe just because he/she knows how to swim. In several cases, accidents happened even though the child knew how to swim. Accidents in the swimming pool can occur very suddenly and without warning. It is very important that all parents follow these basic safety precautions especially if there is a swimming pool at home.

**1 Never allow young children to swim without an adult supervisor.** It is quite common to develop a cramp underwater or receive injuries while diving. It is paramount that there should be persons around to help in such situations.

**2 Do not allow children with no knowledge of swimming in or around the pool.** For good pool safety make sure that all kids above the age of four attend a certified swimming class, or at least learn basic flotation techniques and life saving techniques in case of accidents. Children younger than four should always be accompanied by their parents in the pool.

**3 Enclose your pool with high fences, which can be locked.** Do not leave the pool open and accessible since children can fall inside. Keep your pool safe, and keep your kids away from the poolside.

**4 Avoid leaving your kids alone** even with small bodies of water like portable pools, buckets, fountains, and barrels. There is always a danger of drowning occurring even in small bodies of water.

**5** In case of a backyard swimming pool, **make sure that the cover of the pool is completely lifted over the pool.** Do not partially open the pool. Also make sure that your child does not walk over the pool cover.

**6 Avoid spas and hot tubs.** especially in the case of younger children who are susceptible to overheating.

**7 Keep all devices and toys not designed for the pool away from the water.** Toys, especially those with wheels are easy to drive over. Also, keep electronic devices away from the pool.

**8 Get out of the pool if you hear thunder.** Move indoors for the duration of the thunderstorm.

**9 Make sure there is always a life saving flotation device handy near the pool.** Also, every parent should be familiar with basic CPR techniques in case of any accident.

**10 Be observant.** Watch what your kids are up to and supervise their activities. Do not leave them alone.

## Water Rate Increase Notification

Union City purchases water from the City of Atlanta. Effective July 1, 2011, the City of Atlanta increased its water rates by 12 percent. In response, Union City adjusted its water rates in tandem. Effective, September 1, 2011 water rates will increase by 12 percent. The new rates will be reflected on your utility bill which you will receive in October 2011. The water availability charge remains \$4.00. Below are the new rates for water usage.

## Pluto K-9 Welcomed to Police Department Fold

The Police Department has recently re-instituted its K9 program. In early 2011, the department purchased "Pluto", a 3 ½ year old Belgian Malinois. Along with his handler, Officer Mike Bowman, "Pluto" underwent seven weeks of rigorous and intensive training. At the conclusion of the training, "Pluto" was certified to detect and locate a variety of controlled substances, track and catch criminals, locate missing persons, conduct building searches, and provide protection for his handler.

The duo of Officer Bowman and "Pluto" didn't waste any time in utilizing their training and experience when their combined efforts led to the discovery and seizure of over 500 pounds of marijuana during a combined road safety check involving multiple agencies. This occurred only three weeks after the K-9 was placed into service.

## Promotions at Union City Police Department

Eugene Tate was recently appointed to the position of Field Operations Captain. Captain Tate, a 19 year law enforcement veteran, is also a member of the Department's tactical team, and a certified law enforcement instructor who regularly teaches at the regional police academy.

Captain Mike Jones, because of his experience as an investigator, has been reassigned as Technical Services Captain and will oversee the investigative component of

the Police Department. Captain Jones is also a member of the department's tactical team and regularly assists in teaching training classes to agency personnel.

Antonio Lee was recently promoted to the position of Sergeant. Sergeant Lee is an eleven year veteran of the Department and is tasked with supervising the Anti Crime Unit.

## Crime Free Multi-Housing Program

As part of its crime prevention initiative, the Police Department recently began promoting the Crime Free Multi-Housing Program. The Program is a state of the art crime prevention program designed to reduce crime, drugs, and gangs in apartment properties. It consists of three phases that must be completed under the supervision of the Police Department and includes training for apartment management, security site surveys of the property, and public awareness training for residents. After completing all three phases, the apartment complex can be declared a crime free housing zone. This declaration allows apartment management to enforce more stringent lease guidelines with regard to criminal, drug, and gang activity.

#### Register for a CPR Class and Help Increase Survival Rates

Union City's Fire Department (UCFD) hosts CPR training on the 2nd Saturday of each month from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The cost of the program is \$25 and includes CPR cards as well as training materials. Participants will learn how to identify signs of a heart attack, resuscitate an unconscious person, and administer first aid for choking. UCFD has a goal to train more than 50 residents and 25 business employees during 2011.







# Property Tax Assessment Notices Received

**P**roperty owners received a form in the mail from the Fulton County Tax Assessor's office. A new Georgia law was recently passed (SB 346) that requires each County to send this notice – called an Annual Notice of Assessment – to every property owner. The Notice will show your current property assessment, along with an estimate of the County, School and State property taxes.

Property owners are encouraged to compare the 2011 appraised value of their property to the value listed on last year's tax bill. If the 2011 appraised value did not change, and the applicable millage rates remained the same, the likelihood

is that the 2011 tax bill will not change. If the 2011 appraised value decreased, and the applicable millage rates remained the same, the likelihood is that the 2011 tax bill will decrease as well. Presently, there are no plans to make any changes. Hence, the 2011 City millage rate should be the same 9.5 mills as was billed in 2010.

These property tax assessment notices are not tax bills. Property owners can expect to receive their tax bills this Fall.

On the new form, the City exemptions and estimated 2011 ad valorem tax is not listed. However, this does not mean that they are not in place, it may just not be reflected on the notice. Be aware that the information on the form is only an estimate and may not be the amount on your annual Property Tax Notice. 
