Industry in Union City

Union City has gained the attention of top businesses and developers from around the country. For years, some of the most leading and innovative companies have become highly invested in various locations throughout the City. The Community has a distinctive blend of new and established business clusters that are strategically designed to succeed. Its success is due, in part, to local and regional resources, a highly educated workforce, competitive incentives and state-of-the-art industrial parks. With a strategic location, successful businesses and unique retail developments, companies are continuously investing in Union City. The City is dedicated to advancing its quality of life and making the area a regional entertainment and shopping destination.

Atlanta Hartsfield-Jackson Airport

With nearly 90 million passengers annually, Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport is the world's busiest Airport. The Plane Train, the Airport's underground automated people mover, connects all six concourses with the terminal. The wait time is less than two minutes between trains. The Airport also offers convenient transportation to downtown Atlanta and points beyond through a Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority (MARTA) station inside the terminal.





World of Coca-Cola

With 60,000 square feet for you to explore, the World of Coca-Cola features more than 1,200 artifacts from around the world that, until now, have never been displayed to the public. You'll see great interactive exhibits such as a thrilling, multi-sensory 4-D movie and a fully-functioning bottling line. The World of Coca-Cola has a favorite tasting experience, with an opportunity to sample over 60 different beverages from around the world. A visit of the entire attraction is estimated to last an average of 90 minutes.

Georgia Aquarium

On November 23, 2005, the Georgia Aquarium officially opened its doors to the public. As the world's largest aquarium, Georgia Aquarium features more animals than any other aquarium in more than ten million gallons of water. Through a path of more than sixty exhibits, the Aquarium tells a global water story with features modeled after the greatest zoos and aquariums in the world. Each majestic exhibit is designed to inspire, entertain and educate.

Atlanta Braves / Turner Field

After opening in 1997, the "Home of the Braves" has quickly become an Atlanta landmark and the benchmark for future baseball park design. Turner Field combines the nostalgia and the atmosphere of old-time baseball with state-of-the-art family entertainment unlike that of any other park. At all times, fans are entertained and informed of Turner Field activities through superior sound systems, the Braves Vision video board in center field, the Plaza Vision board in the Fan Plaza and over 500 television monitors situated throughout Turner Field.

Atlanta Falcons / Georgia Dome

The Georgia Dome is the largest cable-supported domed stadium in the world that opened in 1992. Located in downtown Atlanta, the Dome is the home venue for the Atlanta Falcons, host to Super Bowl XXVIII and XXXIV, host of the gymnastics and basketball events for the 1996 Olympic Games and host to both a Men's and Women's NCAA Final Four.

The History of Union City

Union City, Georgia was established as a result of two individuals, Drewry Arthur Carmical and Charles Simon Barrett. Barrett was the newly elected president of the National Farmers Union at a time when the Union was looking for an appropriate location for its headquarters. The City was officially named as the result of the location of the headquarters.

A charter was drawn up for the new town and signed on August 17, 1908. Since that time, the community has continued to evolve and is known for its quiet neighborhoods and growing business districts. Drewry Carmical became the first mayor of Union City. He was chairman of the town's school board and manager of the implement company.

Between 1908 and 1910 the Carmical/Green House which is presently known as the upscale restaurant called Green Manor was built and sits today on Watson Street. The Green Manor is now owned and operated by the grandchildren of Dr. Green, one of the first doctors in the community. It is located in the City's historical district.
