City Manager Reports:

• Pedestrian System Phase One Update

At this time City Manager Fillingame asked Public Services Director Cedric Clark to come forward and provide an update regarding the pedestrian system.

Mr. Clark addressed the Council and informed them that Bond Group Seven was put on hold due to budget constraints. He added that this is a companion project with the Pedestrian System Phone One Project and they both have the same scope of work on the same streets. He added that we would need to notify GDOT and send a letter asking to move forward on the project. He concluded that the he just wanted to make sure that the Council was aware of this prior to taking any action and contacting GDOT.

SAFER Grant

City Manager Fillingame informed the Council that the Fire Department recently applied for the SAFER grant in the amount of \$710,454.00 in federal funds, there is no match required with this grant and it will fund six fire fighter positions.

Chief Leasher informed the Council that we can expect the award around November. He added that this is a fully funded project for two years and includes benefits and after two years if the City cannot afford to pay the six fire fighters, we would have to let them go. He further added that he could reapply to keep them for two additional years, but it would have to go through the same process.

Councilmember Mealing praised the staff for pulling off a great Al Jarreau concert. She added that she has received a lot of great feedback on the Public Services Department and she appreciates the work that they do.
