IX. PUBLIC HEARING(S):

A. A **Public Hearing** for Council to approve the submittal of a request to rezone and create a new PUD (Planned Unit Development) for approximately 30.87 +/- acre tract of land regarding Parcels ID 09F210100880665 & 09F210100882570 located south of Union Pointe Place and west of Lower Dixie Lake Road from PUD (Planned Unit Development), with an underlying residential to PUD District with underlying zoning of RM (Residential Multi-Family).

On motion of Councilmember Hobbs, seconded by Councilmember Owens-Twaites and carried, Council agreed to rezone and create a residential multi-family Zoning District underlying the existing PUD with the following condition: Developer to include a swimming pool, playground, and pavilion (covered picnic shelter). Vote was unanimous.

At this time, Councilmember Hobbs amended the motion to add the condition to increase the side yard setback from five (5) feet to fifteen (15) feet. Councilmember Owens-Twaites amended the second accordingly.

On the amended motion of Councilmember Hobbs, amended second by Councilmember Owens-Twaites and carried, Council agreed to the following condition: Increase the side yard setback from five (5) feet to fifteen (15) feet. Vote was unanimous.

Michelle Mccauley (LeCraw Engineering, Inc.) requested a deferral so that the above conditions can be discussed with the Developer.

On motion of Councilmember Hobbs, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Mealing and carried, Council tabled the items for 30 days (July 19, 2022 Regular Council Meeting). Vote was unanimous.
