

TEEN COURT GUIDELINES

Overview: Participates will hold the role of all court personnel from Judge, jury, clerk, bailiff, and Solicitor on a rotation basis. Therefore, applicants must demonstrate an ability to treat each case individually, with objectively and without prejudice. Applicants must have an ability to communicate with their peers, work in a group of their peers and be able to maintain confidentiality.

Qualifications: Participates must be a student currently in the 10th -12th grade within the South Fulton County area or be a college freshman in the metro Atlanta area. They must be in good academic standing and have a **3.0** or better GPA.

Training: Participants selected for the program will be required to attend a full day "**mandatory**" training on a Saturday. Completion of the training program will award applicants privileges of being a Teen Court Participate.

Participation Requirements:

- Participates will only be allowed 2 absences from Court during the 23-24 Teen Court season.
- Participates must follow the Teen Court guidelines, maintain confidentiality, treat all participants with respect, and follow the court rules.
- All participates must listen objectively during the hearing and assign a constructive sentence designed to hold the defendants responsible for his or her actions, accountable to the community and the victim.
- All participates must arrive on time, dress professionally, ensure confidentiality, be dependable, and exhibit professionalism at all times.
- Participates must commit to serve one Wednesday a month from September to
 April. Teen Court hearings will last approximately two hours beginning at 6:30 pm.
 Participates will meet at 5:00 pm for dinner and case reviews.
